Pastor's Report

"God loves you and there is nothing you can do about it." If this is the only message that I have been able to get across in 2011 then it has been a successful year. This affirmation has brought smiles and laughter in worship. I have repeated it often in many venues: from church dinners to pastoral visits, from gatherings in convalescent homes to private moments of prayer. I believe that it is the core of the gospel and that is why it speaks to people on many levels soliciting both joy and relief. There is nothing we can do about God's love; there is no way to restrict it. There is, however, a great deal we can do because of it: we can say thank you, we can share it with others, we can live joyful and meaningful lives! And this is our mission at Grace Church...to celebrate and share the all-encompassing love of God through Jesus Christ.

The stated goal of our ministry is to "effectively share the love of Jesus Christ and invite others into deepening discipleship and active participation in the life of our community of faith." Throughout this annual report you will discover how Grace Church has been intentionally pursuing this goal. I am honored to be a part of it and delighted to be able to help shape it. My job calls me to a variety of activities including: leading worship and preaching, teaching classes, moderating Session, working with committees, and making pastoral visits. God's love has been celebrated through baptisms and memorial services, welcoming new members and reaching out to the community. Special services and activities have included an Animal Blessing, Honoring our Heroes on 9-11 and an Interfaith Concert on that same day. We have housed and fed the homeless, shared our space with various community groups, provided opportunities for spiritual growth. Trying to establish an alternative worship service has been fun and challenging, another attempt to "effectively share the love of Jesus Christ..."

It is a pleasure to work with dedicated members, elders, and other leaders. You will see them listed throughout this report. I am grateful for our exceptional staff that helps us to fulfill our mission. Steve Cram enriches our community life not only through music in worship but providing and organizing endless concerts. Judy Williams, our office manager, takes care of many details behind the scene that enable our ministry to move forward including aiding our communications and working with volunteers and various community groups. Charie Reid is the glue that holds much of our work together from that of the Deacons, Adult Education, and pastoral care. Her oversight of the Deacons and work with Witness and Ministry help us to care for our members in need as well as reach out to the local community and beyond. Karen Hastings-Flegel was our part time intern, April-October. Her musical gifts enhanced our ministry as well as her biblical insights and pastoral presence. Pastor Emeritus, Robert Williams, continues to be very engaged, leading the Men's Club and making many pastoral visits. I am blessed to be working with so many dedicated leaders.

In addition to my work at Grace I have been the Moderator of the Presbytery of San Francisco in 2011. This has given me the wonderful opportunity to work with other leaders throughout our region and learn from their insights and ministries. Added to this has been the privilege to participate in ordinations, installations, building dedications, and special anniversaries. This coming year I will complete my three year commitment to the presbytery by being the Chair of the Leadership Council.

My work covers primarily four major areas that relate to Session's adopted goals and strategies (see p. 5):

- keeping our ministry/mission before us and deepening our faith development
- outreach to visitors and the community and support of Discipleship Dept. (side door efforts, RFOG, publicity/marketing, Grace in the World)
- mission interpretation and support of Witness & Ministry Dept. (social justice issues, mission events, and interfaith representation)
- pastoral care (home Communion, hospital, and general visitation)

We continue to face major challenges regarding growth in membership, so that we may share the good news of God's love in Christ for all *and* multiply our effectiveness in ministries and mission. I continually seek to keep before us that our urgency is to share God's love in Christ and that we need to be in prayer about God's vision for this outreach. I stress that we need to pay attention to relationships and reach out with genuine interest in newcomers, whether to a side door activity or to worship. I continue to support Supper and Games and Bunco because they enable us to get to know visitors and to welcome them to worship when the Spirit moves them to come. I am incredibly grateful to Reta Wilcox and the Larsens for their vision for RFOG and for the new people we are reaching in Rossmoor. I am incredibly grateful to each of you who has invited a friend/neighbor and encourage your continuing to build those relationships. Thank you, Linda Neyer, for such able leadership of the combined Discipleship and Congregational Life Departments.

I feel really good about the interest in *Saving Jesus Redux* and follow-up studies. It is well worth my time and effort to find such studies and help lead them, for it is so gratifying to see people stretching as we seek to interpret the way of Jesus for our time.

Vacation Church School reached 28 children, mostly from our preschool and neighborhood, a 50% increase over 2010; Family Camp hosted 84 parents/children and our Holiday Faire served 33 children. We'll need more church volunteers to continue to host the latter in future. Thank you, Aline Wilson, for guiding Worship and Ed Dept.

It is always gratifying to work with Sharon Lyons and Barbara Odell on Witness and Ministry: to support our interfaith efforts (Rossmoor's ICR and Housing (CCIH), our involvement with Warm Winter Nights, the Crab Feed and other mission events. A highlight was having Glenda Hope preach last spring. We hosted the Harvest Festival in Rossmoor for ICR in November. A highlight for me, personally, was the week in León, Nicaragua.

Pastoral Care is an incredible privilege, whether it's sharing home Communion, visiting in the hospital, leading a memorial service, or assisting members and adult children with community resources for aging spouses and relatives. Thank you, Margaret Sandelmann and Linda Lester for leading our Deacons so well.

The Western Christian Educators Conference planning team has continued to be a nurturing experience, as the Committee on Ministry for the Presbytery of San Francisco. I am most privileged to share our ministry with Roger, who is ever gracious, collegial and most supportive.

RESULTS

Each Department of Session and the Board of Deacons is responsible to keep the congregation informed about its work and mission. Our newsletter "Grace in the World" and Sunday bulletins have been the main vehicles for this. Special notices have also been generated through the office and distributed by email thanks to our office manager, Judy Williams. This is the fourth year that Action Plans for the Departments and Board of Deacons have been used to guide and interpret our mission and ministry to the congregation. The latest version of the Strategic Plan (2011-12) was published in the November Grace in the World. Individual action plans have also been made available in the office.

In addition to our two annual meetings where we seek to inform and receive feedback, there was a special "Congregational Conversation" In June in response to the denomination allowing the possibility for gays and lesbians to be ordained. In response to this conversation the Session approved the following welcoming statement which was initially drafted by Elder Hazel Tawney.

This clear statement on every Sunday Bulletin helps us to affirm our welcome and keeps us mindful of the inclusiveness of God's welcome and call.

By the direction of Session, and funding through the Brewen Endowment, a new church video was produced by Seth Hunau. This video was first shown in worship in November and will be accessible through our website and shared with potential new members. It celebrated our ministry which is shaped by the Five Practices of Radical Hospitality, Passionate Worship, Intentional Faith Development, Risk-taking Mission & Service, and Extravagant Generosity.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

The Strategic Stewardship Advisory Committee is a committee of Session giving guidance not only to our annual stewardship program but other campaigns and financial matters. The chair of SSAC, Reta Wilcox, has faithfully produced our quarterly Generosity Journal. The Outreach Committee was also created to help us stay in better contact with members and visitors as we seek to welcome others into our community. In addition to this 2011 has been blessed by Rossmoor Friends of Grace which is strategically creating events for members to invite non-members into our fellowship.

Treasurer's Report

STATEMENT OF THE GENERAL FUND FOR 2011

Grace Church budgeted \$397,100 for its General Fund in 2011. Total income for the budget program came to \$381,995 and total expenses for the year were \$389,100 leading to a \$7,105 decrease in the bank balance.

In addition, Grace Church handled \$194,476 in receipts and \$207,800 in expenses for special accounts and activities during the year, and held \$110,485 in the bank accounts for these items at the end of 2011 (including \$26,017 in funds pledged for the year 2011.)

The year 2011 was again a significant year for Grace Church's investment holdings. At the start of the year, the Church's holdings included four mutual funds valued at \$421,290 and \$385,497 in cash. In addition, \$419,657 was held in funds invested with the United Presbyterian Foundation (UPC).

Upon recommendation by EBIC (Endowments, Bequests, and Investment Committee), it was decided to sell the mutual funds, other than those with UPC, and transmit the cash proceeds plus \$280,000, total \$715,000, to the Select One Asset Management Program. This was completed in January. Of the remaining money, \$180,000 has been used to pay for the expenses of the Sanctuary renewal, the new organ, and other projects.

At the end of the year 2011, the Church Trustees, acting on a recommendation of EBIC, authorized the transfer of Select One assets to Gemmer Asset Management.

There is no outstanding indebtedness.

RESULTS

- The Caring Caller program has been revitalized: eight callers have made 422 visits and 120 phone calls this year.
- Communion elements are prepared, candles are filled, and elders and deacons accompany the pastors on home Communion visitation.
- Memorial receptions are provided when Circles are not in charge.
- Memorial gifts have been acknowledged.
- Note cards are sent to shut-ins, those hospitalized or in need.
- The needs of the Food Bank are kept before the congregation as well as opportunities to bring cans for the Food Barrel and to sort food at the FB.
- \$100 in food cards is made available monthly to Contra Costa Interfaith Coalition for the Fourth Week Food Program
- We worked with the Red Cross, JCC, county and city health services, and Rossmoor to have the Tice Valley Shelter Drill in June.
- With Richard Carll's assistance, we disbursed funds per policies and Mission Budget.

STRATEGIES

Continue to upgrade the campus by managing the maintenance of buildings and grounds. Enhance electronic capabilities of communications with members and public.

RESULTS

- Improvements in the Preschool: replaced sliding glass door, water heater and toilet. Financed installation of donated carpet.
- Purchased new headphones for use in the Sanctuary and Oak Room.
- Replaced Oak Room draperies with Hunter Douglas blinds.
- Repaired faded and damaged windowsills in the Narthex and Oak Room.
- Repaired leads and replaced two control box covers and parts of the water control area under the redwoods.
- Repaired roof leaks in the Sanctuary and other rooms.
- Attempted repair to damaged irrigation system under the redwoods caused by AT&T's construction of a service box.
- Replaced carpet in the Fireside Room with carpet tiles.
- Replaced heating and air conditioning units in the Fireside Room. This project included electrical work, texturing and painting the walls.
- Renovated Fireside Room kitchen by replacing cabinet doors and drawers, counter top and sink. Walls were repaired and painted, new faucets and a garbage disposal finished the job.
- Extensive trimming and pruning of the Oaks and redwoods was completed.
 A rotting tree and roots near Roger's office were removed.
- Library ceiling was repaired.
- Thermostats in the Sanctuary and Fireside Room were replaced.
- Replaced three toilets in the Oak Room restrooms.
- Cleaned carpets in the Oak Room and Library.

RESULTS

Worship: Sunday Morning Worship is our primary offering. Special services have been offered as a way to reach out to the community, they include: celebrating the gifts of women, recognizing the struggle of children & youth, honoring our veterans, 9-11 honoring emergency first responders, appreciating public school teachers. These special services have increased our outreach which is evident in higher attendance on these days. A contemporary Sunday evening service has been started. The Brewen Bequest has funded the hiring of musicians for this service. The attendance has ranged from10-30 as we continue to try to advertise this gathering to those beyond our church community. In January 2012 a special focus is reaching out to our Pre-school Families. Other worship services include Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, World Communion with ATC, Animal Blessing, 9/11 Interfaith Prayer Service, Christmas Eve, & New Years Eve. Steve Cram led a Hymn Sing and many special concerts.

Education: In addition to the Horizons Bible Study of the Presbyterian Women & the monthly conversations of the Men's Club, the Worship and Education Department has sponsored various studies. Wednesday Bible Study continues to be well attended. Video based studies from "Living the Questions" have been well received on Sunday mornings and Tuesday evenings. Special Lenten Studies were offered as well as an Advent Adult study. We offered a Family Camp at Westminster Woods. Volunteers, junior helpers and staff provided 28 children a wonderful Vacation Church School experience.

STRATEGIES

Highlight the church-wide mission programs supported by the Mission Budget and seek to widen the reach of Grace's generosity in the local community and worldwide. We accepted the additional challenge of again raising at least \$10,000.00 for budgeted mission giving = Risk Taking Ministry and Service.

RESULTS

- Created a Mission Budget reflecting support of local mission work in Contra Costa County as well as national and international concerns. The latter includes reconciliation work in Israel and Palestine. (This budget was less than last year.)
- Collaborated monetarily with the Deacons in support of local mission programs of Contra Costa Interfaith Coalition and Contra Costa Interfaith Housing. Members donated \$920 worth of gift cards for Christmas giving.
- Created and/or supported fund raising events towards the \$10,000 mission challenge.
 "Souper" Bowl collection, dinners and musical concerts were supported by members and guests, creating a sense of community as an extra plus for our fund raising endeavors. Sponsored a special donation for Japanese tsunami victims. Hosted the Moonsamy family and speaker, Jeff Picket, Palestinian Activist.
- Answered community needs with special donations to the S.F. Safehouse, Larkin St. Youth Services, Bay Area Rescue Mission, Stand Against Domestic Violence, and Youth Homes. The Giving Tree cards went to CCIC, Garden Park Apartments, and Monument Crisis Center. (See total Mission giving on next page.) Housed the homeless and furnished school supplies for the Garden Park Apartments and Antioch CCIHC program.
- Furnished five food boxes a month to Antioch Child Protective Services with the help of your "in kind" and monetary donations. (Each food box is valued at \$70.00.)
- Picked up/delivered donations of furniture and furnishings for CCIC housing program.
- Interpreted traditional special offerings with mailings to the Grace community supplemented with Minute for Mission deliveries to highlight significance of the offering to Presbyterian mission work - One Great Hour of Sharing, Peace Offering and Christmas Joy Offering. Information was included in bulletin announcements and postings, articles in Grace in the World and display materials.
- Thanked the Grace Community with an invitation to the Harvest dinner where many donated to the food box program. (Funds for the dinner came from a non-budget source.)

Under the sponsorship of Witness & Ministry we provide hands-on mission to a vulnerable population of our community.

RESULTS

The members of the DRC meet weekly and enjoy field trips including visits to local museums, historical sites and nearby restaurants. Our unique program continues to provide invaluable social interaction and memory stimulation for people in the early stages of Alzheimer's disease. Our membership has averaged six participants each week. Our projected year end bank balance is expected to be \$7500.00 of which \$2500.00 is in our Rossmoor Fund Fiduciary account. Our excellent staffing remains the same as in 2010, Bob Stark Director, Florence Stone, Assistant Director, and Marsha Stark Business Manager. In November we added the position of Field Trip Driver to accommodate an expected increase in participants. We have enjoyed the continued support of the Lions Club of Rossmoor, CHEERS, members of Grace and the community of Walnut Creek. With the merging of Kiwanis and Rotary in Rossmoor, at this point, we no longer are assured of receiving the generous support we have enjoyed in the past from Kiwanis. However, the Rotary Club has taken over the annual Alzheimer-Parkinson Fund Raiser which nine of us recently attended. They held a very successful event in November and it is possible that we may receive some support from the Rossmoor Rotary. With the help of Judy Williams we have advertised in the Rossmoor News, and revised our DRC brochure. We held a Scott Kirby piano concert in October and participated in the Annual Rossmoor Health Faire. We have received grant money from the Rossmoor Fund to provide scholarships for Rossmoor residents experiencing memory loss. To date four recipients have benefited from their generous support. A Sing-along Ice Cream Social, with Dick Carll at the piano, was enjoyed in August by the participants, Steering Committee and members of the Rossmoor Fund who were our guests. Our Advisory Committee has continued to offer their expertise to our organization during the current year. We recently held our Annual Holiday Party for participants, caregivers, Steering and Advisory Committee members and staff of Grace. We are presently encouraged about the outlook for 2012.

2011 was an eventful year for Grace Cooperative Preschool, with many exciting changes that helped continue to make Grace a positive place for children and their families. We celebrated our school's 40th anniversary, welcomed the addition of two new teachers, and, with the support of the Business Department, we launched a brand new class option for students: Kinder Prep!

In 2010, California passed the Kindergarten Readiness Act, which gradually is moving up the age cut-off for Kindergarten enrollment. By 2014, children must be 5 years old no later than Sept. 1. (The previous cut-off date was Dec. 2). Many parents at Grace have chosen over the years to give their children the 'gift of time', and have kept them at the preschool for a third year. To accommodate both these children as well as those who are affected by the new age cut-off, Grace began offering the Kinder Prep class this fall. Teaching the class are Trish Kawahara and Joy Martin, both Grace parents as well as accredited teachers. We are very excited to have the energy and experience that they bring, and the reviews from participating families in the KP class have been very positive. We look forward to watching the program grow and develop, and are proud to say we are helping to meet a very real need for the families in our community. We are very grateful to the church for their support as we begin this new facet of our preschool!

Our 40th anniversary was a highlight this year as well. The school hosted an open house event and invited members of the church community and alumni families to join us on a beautiful Saturday in April. The children performed a few songs, a moment was taken to honor and thank Marlene Hall, celebrating her 20th anniversary teaching at Grace, and those who attended had a wonderful time catching up.

Our enrollment numbers continue to stay healthy, particularly in the MWF class. Our Membership/Tours coordinator receives a steady stream of inquiries for tours and availability. The number of volunteers serving on the school Board is the largest in several years, and the spirit of involvement among all the co-oping families has been enthusiastic. This is good, because we've taken on quite a few projects this year, including revising the school manual, updating the school website, and giving the classrooms a facelift with new paint and new carpet (donated by a preschool family). Our accreditation with the National Association for the Education of Young Children is up for renewal in 2012, and some of our parents have been working with our Director in completing the complicated process.

Grace families had the opportunity to take their learning outside the classroom this year, with two notable events: a field trip to the Monterey Bay Aquarium in the fall, and Family Camp at Westminster Woods in the spring. Family Camp continues to be a highlight, and we are so thankful for the opportunity made available to us through the church, and for the organization provided by Charie Reid.

In February we held our annual Pancake Breakfast fundraiser, a successful event that was fun for all. Our theme was "Medieval Enchantment", and the Oak Room came alive with 3 - 5 year old knights and princesses. The families worked very hard to make this one of the best years yet for this event, and the proceeds went towards two programs very dear to Grace: our music program and our scholarship assistance program. The Pancake Breakfast is an event that could not happen without the help of the church community, and it means so much to see the number of church members who attend each year.

It was a great year, but what helped to make it so was the gift of support of volunteers from the Church. Joan Larsen and Margaret Sandelmann created aspiring chefs in their weekly cooking sessions with the MWF class. Ethel Vaughan and Kay Hatch provided a comforting presence for our children in the classroom, and shared their experience with us. Lavenia Black fostered a love of music during her mornings with the children. Dick Pierce willingly donned Santa's beard once again, delighting the children at Santa's Special Visit. Holiday Faire was a popular event, and thanks go to Charie Reid, Roger Reaber, and the many church volunteers who make it possible. And, as always, Judy Williams in the church office provided her support in a myriad of ways from fielding phone calls to helping us with our publication needs. We thank you all for everything you do! Thank for you 40 amazing years, and here's to the next 40 more!
